Annual meeting Feb. 26; reports due next Sunday

It's that time of year! If you are a leader of a ministry or group, your ministry reports for inclusion in the 2011 Annual Report are due by Sunday, Jan. 29. The 2011 Annual Report will be made available to the parish on Feb. 19 in preparation for the Annual Meeting on Sunday, Feb. 26. Details will follow.

A form with a suggested outline for your report was e-mailed to ministry leaders with e-mail access this week, and additional copies are available in the Narthex.

This is a wonderful time to let the parish know what your ministry accomplished in 2011, and what you have planned for 2012. It is also an excellent way to thank those who have participated in ministry in the past year.

After generous response from congregation, budget nears goal

The St. Andrew's Vestry has approved an operating budget for 2012 that is below the originally proposed budget of \$451,000. Final figures show that 129 families pledged a total of \$435,870 to this past fall's annual General Fund campaign.

You'll remember that the originally proposed budget itself was tight, foregoing staff raises for a third year, and holding the line on many other expenses. After additional cuts including eliminating the continuing education allowance for staff, and cutting the Diocesan pledge to \$200, there is still a budget shortfall of \$8,000. At present, that \$8,000 is coming from the Building & Maintenance line item, but it is imperative that we restore this to ensure that we have adequate funds on hand for routine maintenance and repairs to our facilities. For example, just last week, blowers on the furnaces in both the church building and Parish House went out, necessitating repairs costing about \$1,200.

Our current pledging families have been extremely generous in their giving. Sixty-three families increased their pledges this year, for a total increase of \$77,304 over 2011. Fourteen of those are new pledges. Overall, giving from the same 115 families who gave last year, plus the 14 new pledges, increased 14.8 percent, which is phenomenal given the current economy. Our average pledge of \$3,379 is above the national average.

The shortfall comes not because our current members are not giving generously, but because we've lost pledges from some members suffering job loss or other economic hardship, and others who pledged previously have moved out of the area, died

or transferred out. Our total number of pledging families fell by only four, but the monetary difference resulting from lost pledges was \$16,220.

We have been blessed by several families who have stepped forward to increase their pledges beyond what they originally submitted on Pledge Sunday in November. Responding to our year-end projections of a budget shortfall, these families pledged an additional \$12,050.

"Your Vestry and I want to thank you for what you are already doing to support Christ's mission here at St. Andrew's," says **Fr. Ron Baird**, rector. "I know that many of you are giving sacrificially, and we greatly appreciate that."

For those who have been blessed financially this past year, the Vestry is asking that you consider increasing your pledge for 2012, particularly if you haven't already done so. Just as the cost of running a household has increased in the past few years, so has the cost of operating the church. Utilities are up, services such as snow removal, lawn care and building repairs have increased, and the cost of Christian education materials, office supplies and other items has jumped.

"God is always faithful to provide for our needs, and members of our congregation have always responded generously to his call to ministry and mission in this place," Fr. Ron says. "I know that many of you are giving all you can, and I want to express to you how much I appreciate that! For those of you who have suffered from the economic downturn, please know that I also appreciate your efforts to do what you can even if you've had to reduce your giving."

"Others, however, may not have considered how rising costs impact our parish, or how important your gifts really are to God's work in this place. I am asking you to prayerfully consider whether God might be calling you to give more to the 2012 General Fund. If those who are able give a little more, we can make up the budget shortfall, and ensure that we can cover all of our costs in 2012."
