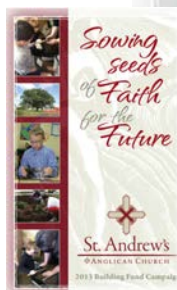
## Pledges to building fund exceed \$307,000

With 65 pledges to the "Sowing Seeds of Faith for the Future" building fund campaign turned in as of this past Friday, the parish has raised \$307,589. This is just over two-thirds the way to our goal of \$400,000, from about 49 percent of our parish families. Sixty seven (67) pledges remain outstanding.

For the picnic, hot dogs will be provided and those attending are asked to bring a covered dish, and soft drinks or similar beverage for your family. If you have any outdoor games you enjoy, bring those along too!

## Sharing God's Love

St. Andrew's serves at the Common Ground Free Store in Delaware on the third Saturday of every other month beginning in January, with the exception of May, when we serve on the fourth Saturday. Each of these volunteers served at the Free Store for the first time in May. **Ask them about their experience, and considering joining them when we next serve at the Free Store on Saturday, July 20, from 9:30 a.m. to 1 p.m.!**

The Free Store — whose mission statement is “Welcoming the Community to Share in God's Love and Gifts” — provides free clothing, household goods, books, toys and more to all in need, regardless of their situation. There are no income requirements or guidelines to meet. The store's philosophy is that everyone is on “common ground.”

Located at 193 E. Central Ave., Delaware, the store's summer hours are Tuesdays from 6 to 9 p.m.; Wednesdays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Thursdays from 6 to 9 p.m.; and Saturdays, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. In addition to providing clients with a free shopping experience, the store serves a hot meal to shoppers. Donations are accepted during store hours, and volunteers are needed most every day.
