Into the smart phone age



We're excited to announce that our online Member Directory is now available in a tablet and smart phone app! And it's all thanks to **Tom James**, who we know as our talented choir director, but who outside of Sunday mornings is a professor of mathematical sciences in the Mathematics and Computer Science Department at Otterbein University.

Several years back during a summer sabbatical, Tom designed and built a similar online directory for Otterbein students and faculty, and the idea for such an app for St. Andrew's has been germinating since. After we switched our online Member Connection to the Open Source Joomla! platform, Tom began work in earnest. And after hours of labor and coding, fits and starts necessitated by frequent upgrades to the system that would necessitate code revisions, and no less than 50 emails back and forth between Tom and **Judy Baird**, our membership and communications director, the app is ready for us to use!

To download the app to your tablet or smart phone, simply enter the following link in the address bar of your device's web browser:

The link will bring up the Member Login box (Figure 1). At this point, you'll want to add a shortcut to your device's Home Screen (Figure 2) so the app will be easily accessible. Our illustration is for an iPad so your screen may look

a little different, but a quick Google search will tell you how to do this on your device. After you add the app to your Home Screen you'll see the app icon on your device, as shown in Figure 2-a on the large colored iPad screen. We've renamed ours "Directory" as a descriptive title.

Click on the app icon (Figure 2-a), and you'll be taken to the login screen within the app, where you'll enter your Member Connection login and password (Figure 3-a). Be sure to click "Save Password" so you don't have to log in each time you use the app. We've highlighted it here in red.

If you are a member of the parish, and don't currently have a login and password, please contact Judy at jbaired@standrewspolaris.org or 740-548-5112, ext. 3, and she'll be glad to set you up with new login credentials.

Once you've logged in you'll see the search field (Figure 3-a), where you can enter the first or last name of the person you're looking for. Alternatively, simply enter the first letter of their first or last name, which will generate a list of all individuals whose first or last names begin with that letter (Figure 3). If only one individual meets the criteria you enter, that person's profile information will come up, if there is more than one person who meets the criteria, you'll simply chose the name of the person you're looking for from the list (Figure 3-b). A Help button in the lower left corner of your screen (Figure 4-a) will provide further details on this step.

The individual's profile includes a picture if one has been uploaded; an email link; their contact phone number and any other phone numbers they've chosen to reveal on their profile; and their address. The data is presented as hot links, so clicking on them will bring up the data in your tablet or smart phone's email app; your smart phone's phone app; or Google Maps.

The Member Directory is password protected, and only members of the parish are listed and can see other members. Email addresses are cloaked,, so that you only see someone's actual email address if they reply to your email. Birthdays and anniversaries include only the month and day, and

Worship focus of Lenten Program

Plans are underway for the 2014 Lenten Study Program, which will be held from 6:15 to 8 p.m. on Tuesdays in Lent, from March 11 through April 8. This year's study will focus on worship, with the theme drawn from Psalm 96, "O worship the LORD in the beauty of holiness; let the whole earth stand in awe of him."

We will also be offering simultaneous program for children and youth. Our hope is that families will come together to make this Lent a time of discipleship, fellowship and worship.

The format of this parish-wide program will follow those of the previous two years, which drew more than 80 adults, youth and children. Each evening will begin with a simple supper of soup and salad at 6:15 p.m., followed by a teaching by **Fr. Ron Baird**. Adult and senior high students will then break into small groups for discussion and reflection on the teaching. The evening will conclude with all ages coming together for a brief time of prayer and worship using the service of Compline from the *Book of Common Prayer*. Each week's session will end by 8 p.m.

As in the past, we're asking parishioners to contribute to the weekly meals by bringing a soup or salad to share. Individuals and families, or small groups, may want to join together to take an evening to provide the food. Sign-up sheets for the meals are available in the Gathering Area, as are sign-up sheets for people who would like to attend the study program.

We hope to do things just a little differently this year, based on the success of last summer's SALT Leadership Conference, when we re-arranged the worship area to allow for more space and flexibility for activities. Our plan is to provide for similar flexibility for the Lenten Study program by moving tables into the worship area, where people can sit for both the teaching and the small group discussion. This should give us all a little more elbow room, allow for space in the Gathering Area for the children to spread out, and cut down on "travel time" between the meal, teaching and small group discussions.

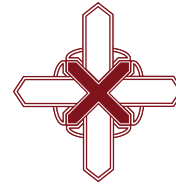

We are pleased that you have chosen to worship with us today, and hope you find our services meaningful and our fellowship warm and friendly. Please join us between services for coffee in the Gathering Area. We also have a welcome gift for you in thanksgiving for your visit with us. If you didn't receive a welcome bag before the service, please see one of the greeters or ushers after church and they'll be happy to give you one.

If this is your first visit with us, please do not feel obligated to participate financially in the offering today. Your presence in God's house and at his altar is your gift to him and to us! We would, however, like to know of your presence with us, and ask that you fill out Information Card on the back of this sheet and place it in the offering plate when it comes by.

This card is also the place to seek additional information about St. Andrew's or record prayer concerns, ask questions or forward any other comments you may have to the staff.

Following are a few hints and tips to make your time with us this morning as enjoyable as possible:

- All baptized members of any Christian church are invited to receive Holy Communion with us here at Christ's table. We do use real wine, administered from a common cup. Although most worshippers will receive both the bread and wine, it is perfectly acceptable to receive just the bread, or just the wine.
- A Nursery is available at the 9:30 and 11 a.m. services for babies and toddlers through age 4 in Room 108, at the end of the hall to the right of the Sanctuary, and Godly Play is offered for children toddlers through 5th Grade at 9:30 a.m. in Rooms 101, 102, 106 & 107, and at 11 a.m. in Room 102. Youth Ministry is offered at 11 a.m. for Middle Schoolers, in Room 201 at the Parish House, and for High Schoolers in the Parish House Conference Room.

At St. Andrew's, all children who have been baptized are welcome to receive Holy Communion. Parents of children in the Nursery are asked to pick up their children at the time when the congregation sings *Behold the Lamb* (9:30 a.m. service), or at the announcement time (11 a.m. service). Children who are in Bible Study will be escorted to the Worship Area by Children's Ministry Team volunteers near the time for Communion.

- Diaper changing tables are located in both the women's and men's restrooms for your convenience.
