## New service times start in September

Beginning the first weekend in September, we'll be introducing a Saturday evening service, and moving to two Sunday morning services, with a dedicated time in between for discipleship for all ages, and a greater focus on fellowship.

This change, which we first announced earlier this summer, comes after much prayer and discernment, several years of discussion parish-wide, in small groups and one-on-one, and

two member surveys. While the surveys alone did not reveal a clear consensus as to service times, there was general agreement surrounding the need for:

- all of our children, who now attend Sunday school at two separate times, to attend class together;
- greater fellowship opportunities between services;
- more time for parishioners and clergy to interact on Sunday mornings; and
- reduced "traffic noise" in the Narthex during the last service of the morning.

Your Vestry and I believe the new worship service schedule addresses all of these needs.

### Children's & Youth Ministry

Our children will benefit specifically by a more consistent class structure, which will allow teachers to plan for a 45-minute class period, including gathering time and closing prayer, which sometimes gets cut short under the current schedule.

### **Prayers for the Church**

Following the Anglican Cycle of Prayer, please pray for Bishop Dr. Maternus Kapinga and for the priests, deacons, religious, and laity of the Diocese of Ruvuma, Tanzania. Ruvuma is one of the 18 mainland and one island dioceses in the Anglican Church of Tanzania, in east Africa. Anglican worship in the area covered by the Diocese began in 1902 and the Diocese itself was created in 1971. The Diocese has been growing, with some 1,000 confirmations since 2000. The Diocese now has 40 parishes (and each parish may have up to five "outstations," served by lay catechists), 40 clergy, and some 55,000 members. Both urban and rural areas are encompassed by the Diocese but poverty is endemic across the area; the bishop has no regular stipend and priests' pay is often overdue by many months, if not years! Please pray especially for St. Augustine Open Seminary, established by the current bishop to provide continuing education for clergy; for the work among youth; for more vocations to the priesthood; and for the Prayer Fellowship.

Following the Diocesan Cycle of Prayer, please pray for Fr. PT Morgan and Fr. Jon Back and for the people of St. Anne's, Anderson, Indiana.

Following the Parish Cycle of Prayer, please pray for Bernie and Ellie Schramm; Mike Schroeder; Frank and Marty Scott; the Senior Saints; and the Community Garden Ministry. Please also pray for all who care for children: Lord, please give them love and patience, remembering that children are a heritage from you, and the Kingdom of God belongs to them.

# New to St. Andrew's? Come learn more about us on Sunday, August 30!

"Class 101: Discover St. Andrew's," an orientation to our parish, will be offered on Sunday, August 30, from 2 to 5 p.m. in the Parish House Conference Room. This class, taught by **Fr. Ron Baird,** is an introduction to St. Andrew's, and is for anyone who is interested in joining the parish, or who just wants to know more about our mission and ministry!

In Class 101 you'll learn about Our Purpose: Why we exist as a church; Our Mission: How and where we fulfill our purpose; Our Faith: What we believe and what God has done for us through his son, Jesus Christ; and Our Commitment: Who God calls us to be and what he calls us to do.

### Who should attend Class 101?

Anyone who is interested in joining St. Andrew's, or just wants to know more about our mission and ministry!

I've been Anglican/Episcopalian all my life. Do I still need to take Class 101? If you want to join St. Andrew's, yes! Class 101: Discover St. Andrew's is our formal method of incorporation into the parish. We think it's important to know a little bit about who we are before you join our parish family. This class focuses more on the mission and ministry of St. Andrew's than it does on the Episcopal or Anglican faith tradition.

I've been coming to St. Andrew's for awhile now. Do I still need to take Class 101? We welcome your presence with us in worship and other activities, regardless of whether you've made a formal commitment to membership at St. Andrew's. We believe, however, that there are some important reasons to make a commitment to a local church community, and this class will help you decide if that is something you'd like to do. Making a formal commitment to membership also makes you eligible to vote in parish elections and serve in positions of parish leadership.

### If I take Class 101, do I have to join the parish?

Although you will be invited to join St. Andrew's at the close of the class, you are under no obligation to do so. Once you complete the class, you may join the parish at any time simply by signing and returning the Membership Covenant that is in the Participant's Manual that you will receive.

I'd like to have my child baptized at St. Andrew's. Do I need to take Class 101? Yes! When your child is baptized at St. Andrew's, he or she becomes a member of this parish. We believe it's important that the parents be members too, since they are covenanting to raise the child in the faith.

### Should I attend Class 101 if I wish to be married at St. Andrew's?

Yes! The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony, the union of a woman and man in Christian marriage, is available at St. Andrew's to couples who are members of the parish. If you are considering marriage, your first step is to attend Class 101. You should then set up a time to talk with Fr. Ron to arrange for marriage preparation, and call the church office at 740-548-5112 to schedule a date for the wedding. There is no cost for the services of the clergy, or for the use of the church, to church members.

opportunity to explore the Bible, and learn about the liturgy of the Church, together with others their age, which will serve to strengthen the bonds of friendship among them.

For children in pre-school through 3rd Grade, we'll offer a Children's Chapel during the Liturgy of the Word at the 9 a.m. service, beginning after the Gospel is read.

Fr. Ron encourages you to make both worship and Sunday school a priority for your family. Children's Chapel differs from Sunday school in that it provides children a place to worship God in a way that is meaningful to them, while Sunday school is where they learn the stories of the Old and New Testament, about the sacraments of the Church, and the story of Salvation. Both are vital to

our children's spiritual growth and development.

Youth will also meet in between services.

### Adult Discipleship

Having a time between services on Sunday mornings will expand our opportunities for adult discipleship. We'll offer a variety of studies throughout the course of the year, which will be both clergy-and lay-led. Fr. Ron will teach the first study, which you'll hear more about as we get closer to Rally Day and the kick-off of our fall program on Sept. 13.

### Fellowship

The new service schedule allows people to "meet in the middle," and gather in fellowship in a less-hurried atmosphere.

### Worship

Our new schedule will look like this:

- Saturday, 5 p.m., Traditional liturgy and Holy Communion, with no music
- Sunday, 9 a.m., Traditional liturgy and Holy Communion, with organ and choir
- Sunday, 10:15- 11 a.m., Discipleship for all ages and fellowship time
- Sunday, 11:15 a.m., Contemporary worship with Holy Communion
