We're sad to share with you news of the death on Thursday, Jan. 21, of Georgiana Pearson, matriarch of our congregation. Georgiana, just two months shy of her 100th birthday, has the distinction of having been a charter member of both St. Matthew's, Westerville, in 1961, and St. Andrew's, in 2008, and was the last surviving founder of our parish.

Prayers for the Church

Following the Anglican Cycle of Prayer, please pray for Primate Bishop Francisco Da Silva and for the bishops, priests, deacons, religious, and laity of the Igreja Episcopal Anglicana do Brasil (The Episcopal Anglican Church of Brazil). Anglican worship in Brazil began in 1810, following a treaty between Portugal and the United Kingdom to allow Anglican chapels (to serve those who were already Anglican) to open in the then Portuguese colony.

The Church is the oldest non-Roman Catholic church in Brazil. Missionary work did not begin until 1890, when American missionaries arrived. The first Brazilian-born bishop was consecrated in 1940 and the Church became an autonomous Province of the Anglican Communion in 1965. The Church covers the whole of Brazil, the largest country in South America and the fifth largest in the world.

The Church suffered schism when the Diocese of Recife, including the bishop and some 90 percent of the clergy and laity, seceded from the national church in 2005 in protest over the national church's liberal stances and became the Anglican Diocese of Recife, joining the Global South realignment movement as an extra-provincial diocese. The national church now has nine dioceses and one missionary district with a total of 120,000 members. Please pray especially for evangelism and social outreach by both the national church and the Anglican Diocese of Recife.
