The Province includes eight dioceses in the islands of Madagascar, Mauritius, the Seychelles, and La Reunion, all located in the Indian Ocean off the southeastern coast of Africa. Anglican missionary work began on Mauritius in 1810 after the island was captured from the French by the British. Missionaries were then sent out to the other islands and the Province was founded in 1973. The number of Anglicans grew rapidly, starting in 1991 with the Anglican Decade of Evangelism and Anglicans now number over 500,000.

Please pray especially for the Province's continuing work in evangelism and outreach to the poor and aged.

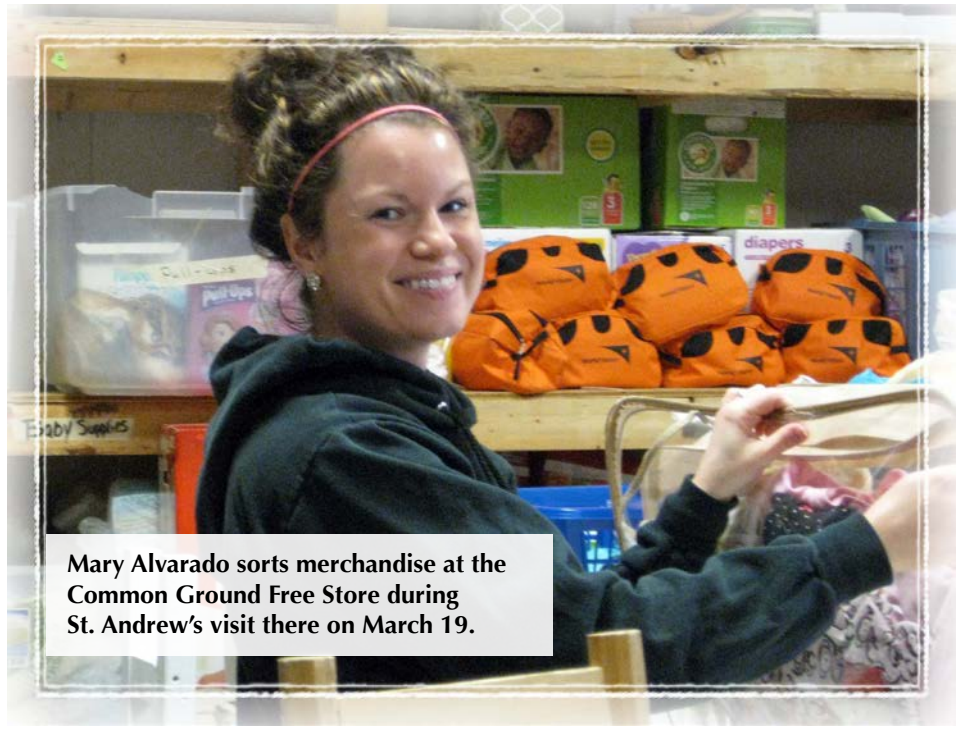

Bishop's consecration April 28

The Most Reverend Foley Beach, archbishop of the Anglican Church in North America, will consecrate the Anglican Diocese of the Great Lake's second bishop, the Rev. Dr. Ronald Jackson, at 4 p.m. on Thursday, April 28, at St. Bernard's Church, 44 University Ave., Akron. Everyone is welcome, and there is no charge to attend just the consecration service at St. Bernard's.

Since parking is not available in St. Bernard's parking lot, those a shuttle bus service will be provided from St. Thomas Hall, 555 South Cleveland-Mass Rd., Copley, to the church. The shuttle will be available starting at 2 p.m. Buses will arrive in 15 minute intervals and will begin their return after the service is over.

A Consecration Dinner Celebration will be held at St. Thomas following the consecration at 7 p.m. There are a limited number of dinner tickets available for purchase at \$50 per person. The price includes dinner, drinks, and dessert. You may log on to www.adgl.us to purchase tickets.
