This campaign calls for us to raise \$400,000 over the next three years, the bulk of which will go toward salary and benefits to call a Youth and Family Life Minister. Fr. on Vestry, strongly endorse the campaign, and together have already pledged \$99,000 toward it, which is nearly a quarter of our goal! Please read through the campaign booklet carefully, and prayerfully consider how God might be calling you to help assure that our young people are equipped to go out into the world to live Christ-honoring lives, and through the Living Water that flows from within them be a blessing to others and a participant in God's plan to reconcile the world to himself. We'll gather pledge cards at all three services next week, and offer our intentions to God as we seek his blessing on this campaign.


Congratulations, Graduates!


