annual St. Andrew's Leadership Touchstone (SALT) conference today from 3 to 5:30 p.m. at the church.


This year we've moved to a Sunday afternoon, which hopefully will accommodate more people who work or have kids' activities on Saturday mornings.

Prayers for the Church

Following the Anglican Cycle of Prayer, please pray for Archbishop Dr. Daniel Bul Yak and the bishops, priests, deacons, religious, and laity of The Province of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan and Sudan.

The Church Missionary Society (from England) began missionary work in the Sudan in 1899 and Christianity spread rapidly among the Africans of the Southern region (those in the northern part of the country were primarily Muslim then, as is true today). Until 1974, the Diocese of The Sudan was a part of the Jerusalem archbishopric. The Diocese reverted to the jurisdiction of the Archbishop of Canterbury until 1976, when the new Province of the Sudan, with four dioceses, was formed.

The Province has been beset by civil and religious strife almost from its inception and Christians were targeted by the Muslim dominated government. There were high hopes that the wars would end with the creation of the world's newest nation, South Sudan, in 2011. Very sadly, the strife has continued and open and armed hostility has broken out between South Sudan's president and the first vice president and factions supporting them.

Despite all the unrest, oppression, killings, and the production of massive numbers of refugees, the Church had grown from four dioceses to 31 dioceses with 4.5 million members in 2010. The Church operates 15 theological colleges and Bible schools and is very active in outreach to the refugees and displaced.

Deliberations are now underway, with the blessing of the leaders of the Church in both Sudan and South Sudan, to separate the Church into two provinces, Sudan and South Sudan.

Please pray especially for a sustainable peace and that resources will be diverted away from weapons and war to the well-being of the people.

Following the Diocesan Cycle of Prayer, please pray for Fr. Kevin Maney, Fr. Ron Feister, Fr. Ric Bowser, Fr. Philip Sang, Mother Nancy Stanton, and the people of St. Augustine's, Columbus.

Following the Parish Cycle of Prayer, please pray for Reed and Lorrie Slevin; Randy and Linda Smith; Shawn, Nikki, Braeden and Kiera Snead; the Daughters of the Holy Cross; and for Discipleship Ministries.

Please also pray for those in construction: Lord Jesus, You worked as a carpenter constructing objects from wood. Guide all construction workers to understand the purpose of what they are building, and to do the job with good quality, for your glory.


