## Parish supports Julie Baldwin on mission to El Salvador this July



## Adult Forum to explore the Gospels

Fr. Will Verhoff wraps up his teaching on the Old Testament sacrificial system during the Adult Forum this Sunday, and next Sunday, June 18, we'll jump ahead to the New Testament and an exploration of the Gospels. Fr. Ed Steele will facilitate "The Four Gospels: History, Literature, and Faith."

We all agree that the Gospel stories we find in the New Testament, are the basis of what we know about Jesus. We also acknowledge how these stories, originating in various locations by various Jewish authors, became the foundations of Christianity. But what do we know about the political world in which these were written, or the historical context of these writings?

Over the course of eight weeks, we will be examining the gospels, but not only how the Christian faith has traditionally interpreted these writings. We will also look at them from the literary and historical viewpoints, as well as learn about some of the various tools and resources used by modern biblical scholars. We will talk about the Messianic Secret, the Synoptic Problem, and other issues that may be new, but not unimportant to our deeper understanding of the New Testament.

The Adult Forum meets on Sundays from 10:15 to 11 a.m. in the Sanctuary.

This is a course that will take two meetings a month until early July. Participants may benefit from purchasing the book and reading chapters in between meetings.

am humbled and honored to serve him in this way.

I am grateful for all of you, my St. Andrew's family, for your support. Please continue to pray for safe travels for all of us going on this trip and pray that we will accomplish what God has called us to do.

Just a little info about the trip. There are 15 of us going to San Salvador, the capital of El Salvador. Fourteen more are going to Choluteca, Honduras, a neighboring country. My group will be working with the Children's Community Center, similar to an after-school program. We will spend time with the kids sharing our testimony and the Good News of Jesus Christ. We will also work with the local church to find families in need of the love of Jesus, serving them as best we can.

If you would like to help out in a tangible way, there is a need for school supplies and hygiene supplies.

Examples of school supplies needed:

- 10 boxes each of 20-24 count crayons, markers, and colored pencils
- 40 rolls of colored crepe paper
- Colored construction paper
- Notecards
- Games, puzzles, and coloring books
- Composition notebooks

Examples of hygiene items needed:

- Soaps, deodorant and lotions
- Toothbrushes and toothpaste
- Shaving items
- Shampoo

Monetary gifts are welcome, as well. Part of the money collected for our travel expenses goes toward purchasing needed supplies, too.

Each traveler/missionary is allowed one suitcase (provided) to fill up with 50 pounds of supplies.

My last group meeting is Sunday July 9. I will take all donations to the meeting to be sorted and packed. There is a box in the Gathering Area marked El Salvador. Thank you for whatever you can do.
