## Prayers for the Church

**Anglican Cycle of Prayer:** Please pray for Bishops Leopold Frades and Peter Eaton and the clergy and people of the Diocese of Southeast Florida in The Episcopal Church.

The Diocese was created in 1969 when the Diocese of South Florida was divided into three dioceses. At its inception, the Diocese of Southeast Florida had 75 congregations and 30,000 communicants. The current diocese is very diverse, with seven primarily Haitian congregations, a primarily Cuban congregation, and services in Portuguese, Spanish, Creole, and other languages. The diocese has been heavily influenced by successive waves of immigrants and now ministers to over 5,000 refugees from over 30 countries each year. Extending from Key West in the South to Jensen Beach in the north and Clewiston in the west, the diocese includes large cities such as Miami, Fort Lauderdale, and West Palm Beach, along with small town and rural areas. Churches in the diocese sponsor many preschools and daycares along with a large (approaching 500 students) elementary school. Many parts of the diocese were battered by Hurricane Irma and are now bracing for Hurricane Maria. The diocese now has 76 churches with 33,000 members in 2014.

Please pray especially for continued evangelism, outreach to youth and the aged, and for all those affected by the hurricanes and for first responders.
