## Prayers for the Church

**Anglican Cycle of Prayer:** Following the Anglican Cycle of Prayer, please pray for Bishop Stephen Kaziimba and the clergy and laity of the Diocese of Mityana, one of the 36 dioceses in the Church of the Province of Uganda.

Mityana Diocese was inaugurated on May 22, 1977 to mark Centenary of the Anglican Church of Uganda. In this same year Archbishop Janani Luwum was murdered on the orders of then-dictator Idi Amin for the “crime” of speaking out against Amin’s corrupt regime.

The Diocese began with two Archdeaconries and 20 parishes; today it has nine Archdeaconries, one Deanery, and over 68 Parishes plus 20 Mission Parishes with a total of over 515 congregations ministered to by priests, catechists, and Lay Readers. There are now 468,800 Anglicans in the Diocese; 102 are active clergy, plus 14 who are retired. Sixty-two percent are youth.

This primarily rural diocese lies just north of the equator at an elevation of 4,000 feet above sea level and includes four government districts. There are some large towns scattered through the diocese.

The diocese operates schools at the primary, secondary, and tertiary levels and staffs 18 health centers, along with providing seedlings and starter livestock to farmers and families.

Please pray especially for the continued success of the Youth Conferences and the small house groups (some of which have grown into churches). Please give thanks for the blessings of the vibrant Spirit in the diocese.
