## Prayers for the Church

**Anglican Church in North America:** Bishop Felix Orji and the clergy, religious, and people of the CANA West Diocese, one of the 20 dioceses in the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA).

CANA West is one of four missionary dioceses in the Convocation of Anglicans in North America (CANA), founded in 2005. CANA West was launched as a diocese-in-formation of the ACNA in June 2012 and achieved full diocesan status in June 2013. It is a dual church body of the ACNA and the Church of Nigeria in the United States. As such, the bishop has seat, voice, and vote in the House of Bishops of both the ACNA and the Church of Nigeria. It comprises some 35 parishes in 11 American states, (California, Maryland, New Jersey, Tennessee, Georgia, Texas, Wisconsin, Wyoming, Colorado, New Mexico, and Washington) and in 3 Canadian provinces, (Alberta, Ontario, and Saskatchewan). The see city is El Paso, Texas.

Bishop Orji, who is the first bishop of the diocese, is also currently the Bishop Protector of the Order of St. Benedict. Very active within the diocese are the Knights of St. Christopher and St. Mary, Mother of Jesus, and the Ladies of St. Christopher, CANA West. Knighthood, present in many African Anglican churches, is an honor bestowed on men and women distinguished for personal character and notable accomplishments for the good of humanity. In the Church, recipients are persons who have conducted themselves in an exemplary manner in the past, and have equally been available for services to the Church and to Church authorities. Knighthood is a mission of sacrifice and should not simply be regarded as a reward for a job well done, but rather as a new call for greater responsibility in the Church. Members are bound to lead lives of simplicity, prayer, and service and are bound to obedience to the bishop, (Sources: CANA West website, Wikipedia.)
