Prayers for the Church

Anglican Church in North America: Bishop Derek Jones and the clergy, religious, and people of the Special Jurisdiction of the Armed Forces and Chaplaincy, one of the 20 dioceses in the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA).

Under the oversight of the Bishop of the Armed Forces and Chaplaincy, the Special Jurisdiction of the Armed Forces and Chaplaincy (JAFC) supports the endorsement and care of chaplains serving in the United States military, federal and local government, hospital and hospice, law enforcement and other vocational and volunteer chaplains serving their communities. The diocese is the endorsing agency and canonical residence for professional chaplains in the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA) and partners with many other ministries to help the church spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ. The JAFC began as the Deanery of the Chaplaincy of the Convocation of Confessing Anglicans in North America, later becoming the Diocese of the Armed Forces and Chaplaincy before becoming the JAFC in June 2014. The JAFC includes 18 chaplain-led parishes in 15 states plus two parishes in the United Kingdom, one in Japan, and one in Guatemala.

The JAFC sponsors a religious community, the Community of the Order of St. Martin of Tours (St. Martin is known as the “father of chaplaincy”). The community includes married and single men and women who remain laity and dedicate their lives to service as chaplains. The JAFC also sponsors the Centurion Project, an intense 24-session, four-day retreat program addressing post-traumatic stress, combat and operational stress, and moral injury. In addition, the JAFC sponsors the Broken Chalice Prison Ministry and the latter sponsors the Manhood Program, designed for helping fatherless males become Christian men. The Manhood Program is now present in six federal prisons, with plans to expand to four more. Further, the JAFC operates a monthly 30 minute radio program.

Last month, two JAFC chaplains graduated with the highest honors, in the first and second positions in their class, from the demanding six-month Army Chaplains Captains Career Course in Fort Jackson, S.C.

Please pray especially for all the chaplains and all those to whom they minister in the Armed Forces, in prisons, and in hospitals.

Important electronic giving announcement

We want to remind you, as announced in the 2018 stewardship brochure, that St. Andrew's discontinued our affiliation with E-Giving, a third-party payment service, as of Dec. 31.

Most banks now allow their customers to set up automatic payments in advance on a recurring schedule, such as weekly, bi-weekly or monthly, at no cost to you or the church. We encourage parishioners who have been taking advantage of E-Giving to instead make electronic payments through your bank.

Discontinuing E-Giving will save the parish \$1,200 annually in fees charged for automated bank withdrawals and credit card transactions.
