Prayers for the Church

Anglican Church in North America: Bishop David L. Hicks, Suffragan Bishop R. Charles Gillin, and the clergy and people of the Diocese of the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic, one of the 20 dioceses in the Anglican Church in North America.

The Diocese of the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic, with the Convocation of Eastern Canada, formerly known as the New York and Philadelphia Synod, was a founding jurisdiction of the Reformed Episcopal Church in 1873 and, more recently, a founding diocese of the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA) in 2009. It comprises 27 parishes, 26 of them in four American states — Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey and New York — and one in the Canadian province of Ontario. The see city is Blue Bell, Pennsylvania.

The Reformed Episcopal Church of the United States, founded in 1873, was originally organized into synods. The New York and Philadelphia Synod, one of their founding synods, was renamed the Diocese of the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic when the nomenclature was changed in 1984.

As part of the Reformed Episcopal Church, the Diocese of the Northeast and Mid-Atlantic took part in the Anglican realignment movement in the United States, being one of the founding dioceses of the Anglican Church in North America.

The diocese is home for the Reformed Episcopal Seminary, established in 1887, in Blue Bell, Pennsylvania. (*Sources: Diocesan website and Wikipedia.*)

When St. Andrew's serve at Common Ground, we not only provide food for shoppers to have a nutritious meal, but also staff the kitchen, check-in, hospitality, and check-out areas, and help with sorting clothes and stocking racks and shelves.

The store is located at 193 E. Central Ave., Delaware, and is open Tuesdays, from 6 to 9 p.m.; Wednesdays, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Thursdays, from 6 to 9 p.m.; and Saturdays, from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. Help is always needed on these days, as well as on our regular service days.
