## A reminder regarding room setup for meetings, events

Nearly every night of the week, there is something going on at St. Andrew's. To assure that our schedule runs smoothly, and the needs of all the ministries using our facility are met, we share with you a few reminders.

- Please remember to schedule your event or meeting with the parish office, either using our online scheduling system, or by calling the parish office at 614-423-4250. To avoid scheduling conflicts, your event must be confirmed by the parish office before it goes on the calendar.
- After you receive confirmation for a scheduled meeting or event, please remember that the group or ministry itself is responsible for room setup. Always remember to leave the room as you found it, so that it's ready for the next group that uses the space.
- If tables or chairs are needed, they may be found in the storage shed just outside the back door in the Gathering Area. The shed key is hung above the light switch in the workroom off the Gathering Area, where the copy machine and Vestry and ministry mailboxes are located. The key is attached to an old Tupperware lid with the writing "shed key" on it. Naturally, remember to lock the shed and hang the key in the workroom when done. 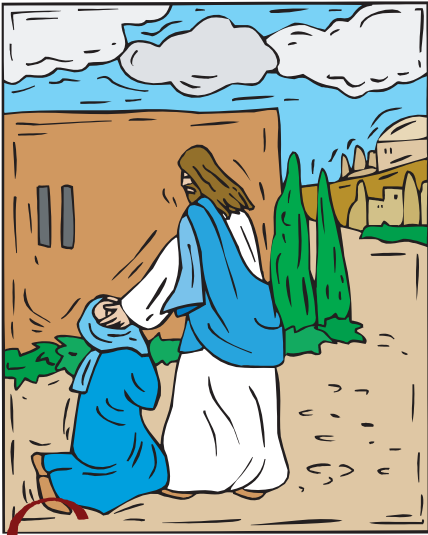
## Coat found, scarf lost

## Repair work nears completion

Repair and restoration work to return the church to normal following the flooding that resulted when frozen pipes burst on Dec. 23 is nearing completion. Painting in the narthex and hallways is underway, and should be finished in the coming week. After the paint has dried, the carpets will be cleaned and baseboards installed.

We are also pleased to report that an environmental assessment performed earlier this month has determined that there are no significant concentrations of airborne fungi in the building as a result of moisture that collected in the carpets and drywall when the pipes burst.

Safex, the company that performed the study, reports that the airborne fungi concentration collected at representative locations inside the church indicated low concentrations, the moisture content of the drywall in affected areas was not elevated and there was no visual observation of suspect fungi growth on drywall surfaces where the baseboard was removed. "At this time," the report says, "the airborne fungi concentrations and drywall moisture content are not considered unusual."

The study did find that the relative humidity was low due to drying efforts for the carpet and walls, and that irritation experienced by some parishioners was likely due to this low humidity level. Such irritation should lift as the humidity levels return to normal.

In other building news, the permanent parking lot lights should be installed next week, and final grading will be completed when weather warms up in the spring.
