Study on 1 and 2 Peter, book of Jude begins today

Fr. Ron Baird will lead the Adult Forum in a study of the First and Second Epistles of Peter and the Epistle of Jude beginning today through the end of July.

The author of 1 Peter presents himself as Peter the Apostle writing from "Babylon," which is possibly a reference to Rome. The letter is addressed to various churches in Asia Minor suffering religious persecution. 2 Peter likely addresses the churches in Asia Minor in general. The Epistle of Jude is traditionally attributed to Jude, the servant of Jesus and the brother of James the Just, who was a prominent leader in the early Church.

Join us in the Sanctuary from 10:15 to 11 a.m. on Sundays to learn what these eyewitnesses to the life and ministry of Jesus had to say to early Christians, and learn how they apply to the Church—and to our lives—today!
