In 2020, WARM provided nearly 350,000 meals to families in need. WARM also has a workforce development program, child nutrition programs and a vibrant volunteer corps.

Last weekend he shared the following with the congregation at all three services as part of a call to serve those less fortunate in our community, particularly at this coming Saturday's service day at Westerville Area Resource Ministries (WARM). We share it here for those of you who didn't have an opportunity to hear Pat last weekend, and because we think it's a message that can't be repeated too often.*

We at St. Andrew's have an opportunity to follow Christ by imitating His example of service to others. This is one of the most compelling ways that we can express what we believe.

St. Andrew's has a quiet legacy of service. If you look at "The Net" right before the pandemic, it featured stories about our church working in prison ministries, delivering meals and clothing to those in need, and engaging in other projects.

We're called to build on this legacy. How can do this?
