### The Route

- ➔ Piatt Road to Cheshire Road, and ride across Alum Creek
- ➔ Cheshire Road to Rome Corners Road, starting the return to St. Andrew's (SAAC)
- ➔ Rome Corners Road to Plumb Road

development program, child nutrition programs and a vibrant volunteer corps.

## Adult Forum study of 1 and 2 Peter, book of Jude continues

The Adult Forum's study of the First and Second Epistles of Peter and the Epistle of Jude, led by Fr. Ron Baird, continues through the end of July.

The author of 1 Peter presents himself as Peter the Apostle writing from "Babylon," which is possibly a reference to Rome. The letter is addressed to various churches in Asia Minor suffering religious persecution. 2 Peter likely addresses the churches in Asia Minor in general. The Epistle of Jude is traditionally attributed to Jude, the servant of Jesus and the brother of James the Just, who was a prominent leader in the early Church.

Grab a cup of coffee or tea and join us in the Sanctuary from 10:15 to 11 a.m. on Sundays to learn what these eyewitnesses to the life and ministry of Jesus had to say to early Christians, and learn how they apply to the Church—and to our lives—today!

- Canned pasta/soup
- Canned chicken and tuna
- Macaroni & Cheese (the just add water type)
- Canned fruit and vegetables
- Rice
- Canned beans
- Cereal, instant oatmeal, and pancake mix (just add water)
- Instant potatoes.

Please avoid high sugar snacks and junk food.

We also have an opportunity to help one of our local churches that provides groceries and sack lunches to the community.
