Ron Baird's retirement at the end of 2022. They will also be asking for your input.

We want to make this opportunity available for all members of our St. Andrew's family and to do so we have created a Zoom meeting that can be accessed by anyone unable to attend in person. We hope that you will plan to join us either in person, or virtually with both audio and video or just audio.

## Group dedicated to racial reconciliation holding raffle for OSU-Tulsa football game

Sacred Conversations, a Central Ohio group dedicated to fostering mutual understanding and acceptance among Blacks and whites, is holding a drawing for a chance to win two tickets to the Ohio State vs. Tulsa football game on Saturday, Sept. 18, in Ohio Stadium. The tickets are in Section 18A, Row 34, Seats 3 and 4, providing an exceptional view of the game for the lucky winner.

Raffle tickets are \$10 each, or \$50 for six tickets, and are available at the Information Desk at St. Andrew's. The drawing for the winning raffle ticket will be Wednesday, Sept. 13 via Zoom and Facebook Live. The winner will be notified by email with instructions on how to claim their tickets.

Proceeds of the fundraiser will benefit the MCRC Project at North Kentucky University. MCRC, which stands for "Mourning the Creation of Racial Categories," seeks to use dance, drama and commentary to show how sorting people into racial categories "is at the heart of an unresolved American identity crisis ..." Spiritual Conversations, for which Deryck Richardson's wife Nadya serves as convener, will sponsor a screening of two new MCRC Project films addressing this issue on Saturday, Oct. 16, from 1 to 4 p.m. at St. Philip Episcopal Church, 161 Woodland Avenue, Columbus. Tickets to this event are \$15.

Spiritual Conversations has met monthly, via ZOOM since the start of the pandemic. ### Sprucing up

The approach to the church is looking good this summer, thanks to our new sign, as well as the efforts of members of the Handyman Ministry, including Bonnie Freeman, pictured at left shaping the bushes in front of the church building. Our new sign features more vibrant colors and our church name in much larger letters. Rather than including the service times on the sign face we added a panel on the brick base that we can change more easily and more cost efficiently should our service times change, as they have several times since we moved in to the building in June 2008. In addition, the new polycarbonate sign face is back painted, rather than overlaid in vinyl as the old sign face was, which makes it less prone to fading and peeling. Drive by after dark to see what we think is one of the nicest things about the new sign—the sign cabinet has been retro-fitted with LED lighting components, and the burgundy background is opaque block-out paint, making the church name more visible from a greater distance at night.
