Parish discerning sponsorship of Afghan refugee family

With help from our Service Team, St. Andrew's is exploring sponsorship of a three-member refugee family from Afghanistan. This will be a six-month commitment between March and August with federal funding and support from Samaritan's Purse. The Vestry authorized this project and a proposed apartment lease knowing financial pledges have been and will be secured. This humanitarian project presents St. Andrew's with an opportunity to grow in fellowship, leadership and service as we live our faith.

Our church is at a key point. Samaritan's Purse recommends that church sponsors have a "core team" to serve as leaders for specific tasks, such as housing, obtaining health care/benefits, collecting donations and shopping, providing transportation, and arranging

education and employment. Depending on the task, core team members may spend five to 12 hours per week assisting the refugee family, with the time commitment decreasing as the family becomes more independent. Many tasks can be done on evenings and weekends.

"The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few." (Matthew 9:37) We need several more core team

members to collaborate in sponsoring a family. Please prayerfully consider whether you are called to help.
