


Palm Sunday April 10 ushers in Holy Week

Holy Week begins next Sunday, April 10, with the celebration of Jesus' triumphal entrance into Jerusalem, known as Palm—or Passion—Sunday. The palms we carry and the tone of the service signify this note of triumph, yet there is that underlying theme of sadness that permeates the service, emphasized most especially in the reading of the Passion Narrative.

With the blessing and distribution of the palms, we will begin our journey through Holy Week. We will trace the footsteps of our Savior through the streets of Jerusalem, to the upper room where the Sacrament of Holy Eucharist was initiated. We will stand helplessly during the arrest, and then march to the Cross and the pain of Good Friday. We will experience the despair of Holy Saturday

and the vigil of hope in the Resurrection of Easter Day on the eve of that hallowed festival.

We journey with our Savior because we seem, in him, to find resurrection to a new life; a life of grace. If you would experience the true joy of the Resurrection on Easter Day, you must walk the pilgrimage of Holy Week. Make a commitment to yourself now that you will faithfully attend Holy Week services on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Walk the road to Calvary and beyond. Experience the sufferings of our Lord and his disciples.

Experience the joy that the new life of the Resurrection meant for them, and claim it as a reality for your own life!

Holy Saturday an especially meaningful time for Baptism

Holy Saturday, this year on April 16, is a traditional time in the Church for baptisms, as it especially emphasizes St. Paul's words that if we die with Christ in a death like his, we shall surely be raised from the dead in a resurrection like his. We renew our own baptismal vows, as well, reminding us of our immersion in the waters of baptism, seeking life from death, light from darkness, resurrection of the faithful with Christ.

St. Andrew's to offer Common Cup beginning on Palm Sunday

St. Andrew's will return to offering the Common Cup at Communion, beginning on Palm Sunday weekend. Those who wish to receive the wine from the chalice should kneel or stand at the altar rail to the right facing the altar.

If you wish to continue receiving the wine by intinction please kneel or stand at the altar rail to the left facing the altar at the 5 p.m. Saturday and 9 a.m. Sunday services, and stand in the center aisle before the altar at 11:15 a.m. service. If you wish to receive the bread only, which is a full and valid communion, simply indicate this by shaking your head no when the priest gets to you.
