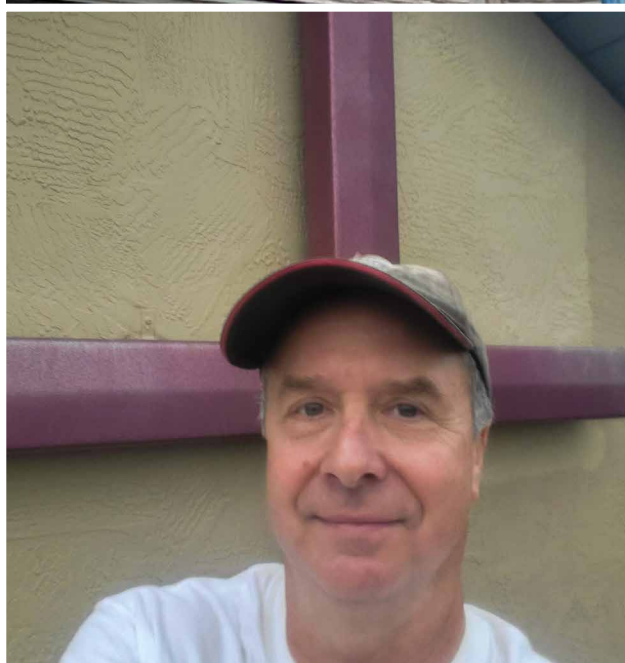

Harvest Festival Fundraiser today

The St. Andrew's Harvest Festival Planning Team will host a fundraiser on Sunday, July 24, from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m., at California Pizza Kitchen in the Polaris Fashion Place shopping mall. The restaurant will donate 20 percent of proceeds from qualified food and beverage sales from the fundraiser to St. Andrew's. Monies will be earmarked for the Harvest Festival, which is scheduled for Saturday, Oct. 1, including for children's games and activities. Liturgical changes in effect this week

Beginning this weekend, we will be using the Renewed Ancient Text, which begins on Page 123 of the Book of Common Prayer, for the liturgy at all three services. Bishop Mark Engel has let the Diocese know that he plans to use this service at all parish visitations, and Fr. Ron wants us to become familiar with it before he comes for his next visit to St. Andrew's.

Use of the Renewed Ancient Text will bring some changes especially to the 11:15 a.m. service, which will include using all of the Scripture readings and some additional prayers. Fr. Ron is making these changes to allow the new rector to be able to use an authorized prayer book service rather than the abbreviated service that he designed before the new prayer book was released in 2019, and which has only ever been used in our parish.
