On Tuesday September 20th we are starting a new study entitled "How (not) to read the Bible" by Dan Kimball. The study will begin on Tuesday September 20th at 7:30 pm and continue every other Tuesday. Come and discover if the Bible talks about Unicorns? You need not bring anything, just come.

Excerpts from the cover of the book:

Is Reading the Bible the Fastest Way to Lose Your Faith. Difficult questions arise when we read the Bible. Is God pro-violence? Does God endorse slavery? Should we all be vegetarians? Are tattoos sinful? Why does the Bible feel so anti-women and anti-science? Questions like these have caused many to question the Bible; we need to address these issues that come up about the Bible so we can answer these questions for ourselves and others. There are 6 sessions each with a short video and time for discussion. Sessions include:

1. Never Read a Bible Verse
2. Stranger Things
3. Boys' Club Christianity
4. Jesus Riding a Dinosaur
5. My God Can Beat Up Your God
6. Rated NC-17
